Immanuel Lutheran Church By-Laws Changes: Nominating Committee

In the By-Laws of the Immanuel Lutheran Church Constitution, Article III, Subsection B states that, "A Nominating Committee of at least three voting members shall be appointed by the President of the Congregation at the April quarterly Voter's Assembly. A slate of candidates shall be presented, if possible, to the Voter's Assembly at the October Quarterly Meeting."

A proposal raised by the President of the Congregation at the Voter's Assembly of October 23, 2022 would change the By-Laws in Article III, Subsection B, governing the composition of the "Nominating Committee." A motion passed at that Voter's Assembly to redefine the structure of the "Nominating Committee" to "consist of all church officers and board chairs."

Discussion at the January 8, 2023 Council meeting decided on a less cumbersome change; simply including the Board Chairs in the Nominating Committee.

The Immanuel Lutheran Church Council proposes that Article III, Subsection B will now read, "A Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the President of the Congregation at the April quarterly Voter's Assembly. The Nominating Committee should consist of three members appointed by the President and also include the Chairman of each of the four boards. A slate of candidates shall be presented, if possible, to the Voter's Assembly at the October Quarterly Meeting." (Proposed change in *italics*.)

The Council asks that this proposal be considered by the Voter's Assembly at the January 29, 2023 meeting.
