The Reformation took place at a time when God was using His Word to bring reform to the church. God was changing the church from what it had become; to what He desired it to be. Reformation was a time when the Lord, through His Spirit, raised men up who were willing to stand for what was God pleasing and true; even if it meant putting their lives on the line. Dr. Martin Luther was one of these men called by the Lord to bring about change. He was called to stand up to the church of His day and lead His church to face the ways in which it was walking contrary to the Holy Scriptures. Luther, though far from perfect, was led by the Holy Spirit to stand on the principles that we still stand on today: Grace alone; Faith alone; and Scripture alone. He was a servant of the Lord, and his tool was the Holy Scripture.

Opening Prayer **Opening Hymn:** *“A Mighty Fortress is Our God” 656 (Please Rise)*

Invocation: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

P: God desired that His Word, be clearly and understood in clarity **C:** *He led a man, who struggled long and hard to see His Truth.*

P: God patiently formed and shaped his understanding and brought him wisdom through His Holy Spirit. **C:** *Truth not of human wisdom, but truth based upon the inerrant Word of God.*

P: God provided this man strength, courage, and stubbornness to enable him to accomplish his task. **C:** *He was to bring the focus of the church back to the Cross.*

P: Luther taught God’s truth: “We are saved by grace, through faith, without works so no one could boast.” **C:** *He proclaimed boldly that we stand on Scripture Alone, Faith Alone, and Grace Alone.*

P: We do not trust in the teachings of Luther for our comfort and strength. **C:** *We trust in the clear teachings of the Holy Scripture which point to salvation coming from the cross.*

Confession:

P: It is by grace alone that we are forgiven. Today we come in confession, realizing that we are truly unworthy of God’s forgiveness and love. We desire to lay ourselves bare before Him, that we might then turn in repentance and hear His gracious Word of forgiveness.

C: *Holy and Gracious God, we admit that we are altogether sinful and impure. We, too often, have not loved You nor our fellow human beings. We have neglected Your Word, its commands and its promises. Our works of love at times have been shallow or nonexistent. We have truly sinned in thought, word, and action. We ask Your forgiveness, for Jesus’ sake. Amen.*

P: God has heard your cry of confession. For His mercy's sake, on account of the merits of Jesus Christ, God forgives you all your sins; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Introit: *Psalm 46*

P: God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. **C:** *Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging.*

P: There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, **C:** *The holy place where the Most High dwells.*

P: God is within her, she will not fall; **C:** *God will help her at break of day.*

P: Nations are in uproar, kingdoms fall; **C:** *He lifts His voice, the earth melts.*

P: The Lord Almighty is with us; **C:** *The God of Jacob is our fortress.*

P: Come and see the works of the Lord, the desolations He has brought on the earth. **C:** *He makes wars cease to the ends of the earth. He breaks the bow and shatters the spear; He burns the shields with fire.*

P: "Be still, and know that I am God; **C:** *I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth."*

P: The Lord Almighty is with us; **C:** *The God of Jacob is our fortress.*

All: *Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.*

Luther's Morning Prayer:

C: *I thank You, my Heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your Holy Angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.*

Choir: "On Faith Alone"(10:15)

Scripture Alone- is a basic truth and principle of our faith. We believe and confess, without reservation, that the Holy Bible is the inerrant Word of God. It was brought to us through the work and will of the Holy Spirit, Who led men to write the exact Words the Father desired for His people. No Word of Scripture fails to be the Lord's authority, because all of Scripture is His Word and Authority; and it will never fail to provide us His truth. We trust not in the wisdom and word of man, but in the Word of the Almighty God alone found in the Bible.

Faith Alone- Faith is a gift of the Lord to His people, through His Word and Spirit. Faith is the gift which enables us to grasp the promises and truths the Lord has placed into His Word. Faith is that blessing which all believers possess, it enables us to receive the wonder of His grace, and to be blessed in His Sacraments. Faith offers us hope, assurance, and the comfort of knowing salvation has been granted to us freely by the Heavenly Father. The Scripture tells us: *“Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen”*. Faith grasps a hold of the Cross and makes us secure in our salvation.

Grace Alone- Grace is God’s underserved love showered upon His people through His loving mercy. Grace alone is why we receive His gifts, because every one of us is a sinner; deserving of nothing but damnation on our own merit. Grace is from God; it stems from His desire to make us His own. He has chosen His “Means of Grace” and they are: His Word, His Sacraments, and the Pronouncement of Absolution. These each demonstrate, grace does not and cannot stem from us, but stems from Him alone.

Hymn: *“O Little Flock, Fear Not the Foe” 666*

Gospel - the Gospel is the Father’s declaration of His love for those who are lost in sin. It is the Father making it clear: His plan, His Work, and His fulfillment alone brought to us eternal life. There is only One Gospel, based upon what Christ alone has done. The Gospel in the narrow sense is very specific: *“God the Father, sending His Son Jesus to earth, as a man, to go to the cross, spill His blood, pay the price, die, rise and grant to us eternal life.”*

Baptism- proclaims to His church His desire to provide His own grace, strength, Spirit, comfort, and forgiveness upon sinners. He opens the heart of those who are sinners, and provides for them eternal life. He grasps a hold of the one baptized and envelops them in His arms and claims them as His own. He gives: *everlasting life; the cleansing of our sins, unity with Him and fellow believers.* Baptism is His remarkable gift to His Church.

Lord’s Supper- is God’s “Means of Grace” to share with us His Son’s body and blood. He provides us: forgiveness, strength to live our faith, unity with fellow believers, and His Spirit to guide and help us proclaim the wonder of His grace in this world. It will always be His Supper because: He is the One who has provided it, He gave us the rules, He gave us His Word, and He supplies His blessings through it.

P: Blessed Lord, who has caused all Holy Scriptures to be written for our learning, grant that we may in such wise hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that by patience and comfort of Your holy Word we may embrace, and ever hold fast, the blessed hope of everlasting life, which You have given us in our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. **C:** *Amen.*
