April 14, 2022 7:00 p.m. The Mixed Oak Cross

Opening Prayer Opening Hymn: "When You Woke That Thursday Morning" 445 vs. 1-3

Invocation: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. C: Amen.

- P: The Cross points us to our Lord's pain C: It points us to the true cost of our forgiveness.
- P: The Cross is a defeat of sin C: It is God's declaration of His means of grace for us!
- P: The Cross is the tool the Father chose C: To demonstrate to the world the depth of His love!
- P: The Cross will stand forever C: As a sign of the cost of evil and the gift of eternal life!
- P: The Cross enables us to have hope C: It is a symbol of the Father's grace to us!
- P: Our Lord met with His disciples C: They gathered to celebrate the Passover Meal.
- P: The room was prepared for the Passover meal shared the History of the Father's love for His people.
- P: Jesus fulfilled the Passover meal C: He then provided to us His Supper, the Supper in which we receive His Body and Blood".
- P: His Cross paid the price for the sins of mankind! C: His Cross brought His grace into the lives of us all!
- P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.
- C: But is we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Confession: Gracious Lord, God of all mankind; we confess that we are daily sinful in our thoughts, words, actions, and desires. We confess that we are not humble, gracious, compassionate, or giving way too often. We confess that we willingly, deliberately, carelessly, and openly defy Your will and desires. We confess that we are silent, ashamed, inadequate, and poor in our ability to witness for You in many situations. We ask, for Jesus' sake, Your mercy and grace be shown to us in granting us Your forgiveness and cleansing. Amen.

Absolution: The Almighty Father has heard your confession, accepted your confession, and willingly and joyfully announces His forgiveness to you. As your pastor, called and ordained; in His name and by His command; I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Psalmody: Psalm 67

- P: May God be gracious to us and bless us and make His face shine upon us. C: That your ways may be known on earth, Your salvation among all nations.
- P: May the peoples praise You, O God; may all the peoples praise You. C: May the nations be glad and sing for joy, for You rule the people justly and guide the nations of the earth.
- P: May the peoples praise You, O God; may all the peoples praise You. C: Then the land will yield its harvest, and God, our God, will bless us.
- P: God will bless us C: And all the ends of the earth will fear Him.

All: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning is now, and shall be forever. Amen.

Collect: Gracious Lord, on this night Jesus met, worshiped, and instituted His Supper and gave to His disciples His Sacrament. We ask gracious Lord that You touch us with Your grace, enlighten us with Your Spirit, provide us Your righteousness and strengthen us to serve You and fellow believers. Envelop us this night in Your truth; secure us in Your hope, and lead us with the desire to share with others the wonder of what You have done for all mankind; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. C: Amen.

Choir: "Cup of Sorrow"

Luther's Explanation to the Sacrament of the Altar:

- P: What is the Sacrament of the Altar?
- C: It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Jesus Himself for us Christians to eat and drink.
- P: Where is it written?
- C: The holy Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and St. Paul write: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the New Testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.
- P: What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?
- C: These words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these works. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life salvation.

Epistle Lesson: I Corinthians 11: 26-30 For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes. Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord, eats and drinks judgment on himself. That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep.

P: How can bodily eating and drinking do such great things?

C: Certainly not just eating and drinking do these things, but the words written here: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of your sins." These words, along with the bodily eating and drinking, are the main thing in the Sacrament. Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say: "Forgiveness of Sins".

Gospel: Luke 22: 7-22 Then came the day of Unleavened Bread on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and make preparations for us to eat the Passover." "Where do You want us to prepare for it?" they asked.

He replied, "As you enter the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him to the house that he enters, and say to the owner of the house, 'The Teacher asks: Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' He will show you a large upper room, all furnished. Make preparations there."

They left and found things just as Jesus had told them So they prepared the Passover.

When the hour came, Jesus and His apostles reclined at the table. And He said to them, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it finds fulfillment in the kingdom of God.'

After taking the cup, He gave thanks and said, "Take this and divide it among you. For I tell you I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.'

And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body given for you, do this in remembrance of Me.'

In the same way, after the supper He took the cup, saying, This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you. But the hand of him who is going to betray Me is with mine on the table. The Son of Man will go as it has been decreed, but woe to that man who betrays Him."
